



BRINGING CHRIST

Into your **home** Into your **family**Into your **life**

Use the reading and reflection below to help your family better understand and dive a little deeper into this weekend's Gospel!

Think: Jesus was teaching in the temple when the Pharisees brought a woman to stand before him. "This woman has been caught doing something wrong, and the law says that she should be stoned," they said. "What do you think?" they asked, because they were trying to trick Jesus. After a few moments Jesus stood up and said, "Let the person who has never done anything wrong throw the first stone at her." The crowd that had gathered began to leave one by one, until Jesus and the woman stood alone. Jesus said to her, "Has anyone thrown a stone at you?" "No, sir," she answered. "You are forgiven," he said. "Now go make a fresh start."

Challenge: Why did the Pharisees want to stone the woman? According to their law, stoning was the punishment required for her wrongdoing. How did the Pharisees mean to trick Jesus? They wanted to see whether Jesus would disobey the law and show the woman mercy. The crowd had been ready to punish the woman, but Jesus made them realize that no one is perfect and we all make mistakes. Jesus understood that people are often weak and do things wrong. He was always ready to give them another chance to change their hearts and their lives, and he does the same for us today. Often we see the mistakes and faults of other people before we notice our own. We should try to be more like Jesus and be ready to forgive others, just as we hope others will forgive our faults. Merciful Jesus, help us to be understanding and forgiving; and to remember that we all make mistakes sometimes but that by turning to you we can make a fresh start. Amen.
